## READING STRATEGY: SELF-MONITORING

We are learning to self-monitor when we are reading. We are noticing when we have stopped understanding what we are reading. We have to listen to the voice in our head that says "Uh oh, I don't get this –"

Reading must make sense, so self monitoring is knowing exactly where the breakdown in understanding has occurred. It could be a word or an idea that isn't understood. When we notice something doesn't make sense self-monitoring helps us to use strategies to restore meaning.

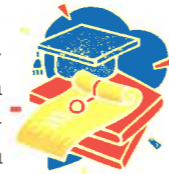
We can restore meaning by rereading. Sometimes going back and re reading it aloud slowly helps. It can help if we create a picture in our heads as we read, or, we might need to read ahead (read on), use the pictures, charts etc for clues or look for part of the unknown word that might give me a meaning clue. If you can recognise when it happens you can use a strategy to fix it.
