These two clowns have a job to clean the park for the grand spring opening. Expect a whole lot of chaos, comic creativity and fantastic situations in what should normally be a very routine day. The clowns will delight you with their antics and share the lunacy of their world. Writer/Director Andrew Cory trained in clowning in Spain and London and has been performing clown for over fifteen years. As an artist he has worked for Queensland Theatre Company, Queensland Ballet, Queensland Opera, La Boite and numerous independent theatre companies. He was the Artistic Director of Backbone Youth Arts for four years.

READING STRATEGY:

Synthesising. "My thinking grows and changes as I read."

Synthesising is combining what I know with new information to understand the text.

"At first I was thinking...."

"When I was reading I was thinking...."

"But at the end I was thinking"

Synthesis needs the reader to join new learning onto the knowledge they already have. Readers determine the key ideas from the text and show their understanding by using that information to produce original thoughts.

We can see students are **synthesising** when they respond to questions like these:

- How would an artist illustrate the details from this part of the story?
- How could you present this information in a table or graph?
- What parts of this text can you use to create new ideas or products?

How can you use the facts you've learned to write a persuasive letter?

ELECTRICITY SAFETY WEEK



Our students have turned into Safety Heroes this week as they learn about electricity and how to behave safely around electrical equipment as part of Ergon Energy's Electricity Safety Week 7-11 September.
