- "I think I will learn.... because...."

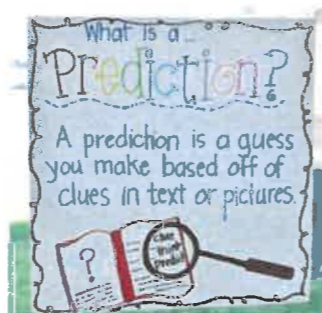
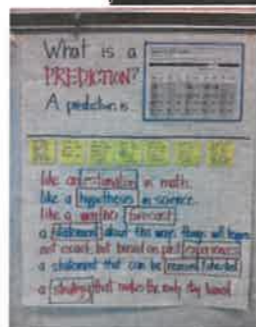
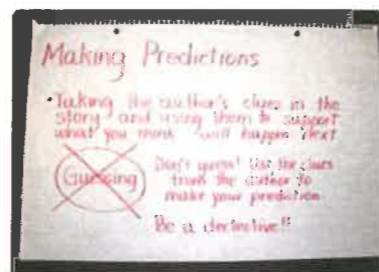
When a reader predicts before reading they can use the
