Year 3 and Year 5 students are sitting their NAPLAN tests this week. These are quite intense testing periods for our students, but none are over 45 minutes. NAPLAN is entirely independent testing but it is external testing. The independent testing we do at school should always be viewed alongside NAPLAN as a measure of how your child is progressing. A combination of the two lots of assessment will give a better idea of progress than one in isolation.

After School Sports will begin over the next week. Athletics is the focus area in preparation for our sports day on the last Thursday of term.

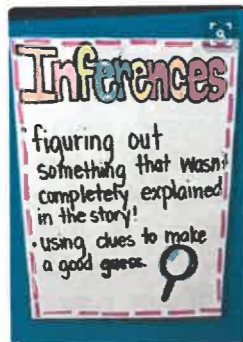

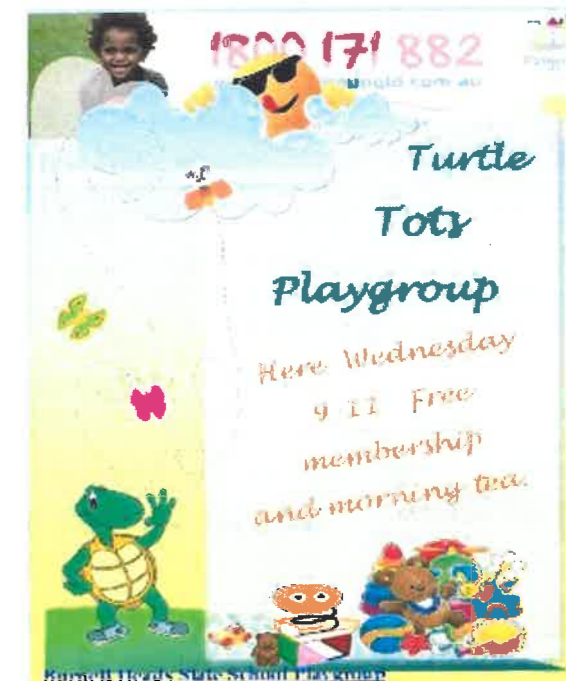
